



Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance finds that "at least 12.4 million children still go without basic, routine vaccines every year".

Nearly 50% of zero-dose children live in three key geographic contexts: urban areas, remote communities and populations in conflict settings.





THF COST COVID

At the end of 2021, essential health services were still disrupted 92% of countries.

Almost 1.6 billion students across the world were affected by school closures

The global prevalence of anxiety and depression has increased by an estimated 25%, with young people and women most affected

An additional 75 - 95 million people were living in extreme poverty in 2022, compared to prepandemic.

Tuberculosis deaths rose in 2020 for the first time in more than a decade, with 1.5 million people died.
